Assembly Apartments, Modern In All Respects, With Latest Improvements

February 28, 1933---Completely modern in every respect, the Assembly Apartments, built by the Warrack Construction Company, are expected to be ready for occupancy by March 13, though a few of the apartments will be finished earlier for tenants who must move in by March 1. Nearly all of the apartments have already been rented or leased.

The finest materials and workmanship have been used throughout the building and the 23 apartments have the latest of modern improvements and built-in conveniences.

Solid brass hardware and glass knobs are used on all the doors. The apartment doors to the hallways are made of Philippine mahogany finished with five coats of rubbed varnish and have small brown grills and plates for the apartment number and door knocker.

Floors in every apartment are of a high grade of oak, except for the kitchen, dinette, and bathrooms. Kitchens and dinettes have installed linoleum on the floor and tenants were given their choice of patterns and other color choices. Walls to the kitchen and dinette are painted according to the desires of the tenants, with two shades of green, others with two shades of yellow, or a plain color with the woodwork in ivory.

China cupboards with leaded glass separate the dinette from the kitchens. A familiar feature of the kitchens is ample drawer space for storage and table space for work. The cupboards have tin-lined drawers for flour and sugar. The draining boards are built in.

Plumbing fixtures in bathrooms and the kitchens are chromium plated and are the very latest style. The faucets have a special valve arrangement for which hot and cold water can be shut off individually.

Each apartment is equipped with a 4 ½-cubic-foot mechanical refrigerator of the type of which was chosen after a thorough investigation by the constructing engineers. Floors in the bathrooms are all ceramic tile with many differences of color and pattern.

First residents of the new apartments, who have been already moved in and are enjoying their new homes, are Mr. and Mrs. Frank A. Boyle, who will arrive in Juneau on the Princess Norah[and] find their apartments ready for occupancy. [abridged]
